2 - HOUSE RULES AND EXTRA SERVICES

HOUSE RULES:

The apartment

With two bedrooms, one with a double bed and the other with two single beds, it has a maximum capacity to accommodate 4 adults and a child who sleeps in a crib. It has a common, modern and pleasant bathroom.

This apartment was designed to provide you with every comfort. It is equipped with a modern air conditioning system and domestic hot water, together with thermal insulation and double glazing, making it very cozy in summer and winter.

The Kitchenette has been completely renovated with dishwasher, induction hob, fridge with freezer, microwave, oven, coffee machine, kettle, toaster and of course, lots of spices and condiments.

It has WI-FI, network sockets in all rooms with high-speed Internet 500/100 Mbps (Down/Up) and Smart TV 46" with 130 cable channels (including international TV channels)

Although it is not obligatory, it is very important to enter a valid email address at the online check-in form so that you can receive timely emails regarding your stay with information on check-in procedures, access codes, the cultural agenda and restaurant suggestions before your arrival.

Security deposit

The holder of the reservation is responsible for any damage that occurs during the period in which he was given the use of the apartment.

We understand that accidents happen, so we kindly ask you to let us know if something breaks. This will allow us to restock it before the next guest checks in.

A security deposit of 200 euros may be charged during the booking process or at check-in when booking through our own website.

Guests and Parties

Parties and events are not authorized. Unregistered guests or visitors are not allowed.

We kindly ask you not to rearrange the furniture and to avoid eating or drinking in the rooms. Please enjoy your meal in the dining room or on the balcony.

Smoke

We have a non-smoking policy in the house. However you are allowed to **smoke on the balcony.**



Pets

No pets allowed. Some guests may have health issues and allergies. Failure to comply with this rule will result in immediate cancellation of the reservation and additional costs for cleaning and sanitizing the apartment will be charged.

Housing bulletin for foreigners

All foreigners must fill in an accommodation form with the details of all the people who will be staying at Casa da Tartaruga.

These details will be requested during the online check-in process and will automatically be forwarded to the Immigration and Borders Service on the date of entry.

Failure to know our clients' details will make it impossible to check them in.

Since 2015, Portugal has more strictly enforced a longstanding law that requires anyone providing paid holiday accommodation to register entry, exit and identification details of all non-Portuguese citizens using that accommodation. This law came into force in Portugal and most other countries in the European Union and aims to prevent human trafficking and

other illegal practices. In this case, it is specifically the article 45 of the Schengen Agreement and the recent law on Local Accommodation in Portugal that brought this rule into sharper focus.

The body that oversees the movement of foreigners is the SEF / AIMA.





In order to validate the data on the accommodation bulletin, the identification card of all guests may be requested during the check-in procedures.

Home appliances

The apartment has all the user manuals for the appliances stored in a folder in the living room cupboard. If you want to download the documents in your native language, you can find a list of them on this site where some manuals have already been compiled.

EXTRA SERVICES:

Upon check-in, the house will be ready to receive you. Towels, toilet paper and soap are provided.

The house has a washing machine, drying rack, iron and ironing board.

The change of bed linen and towels is included every 7 days of rental.

Additional changes to bed linen, towels or house cleaning can be requested at the time of booking, at check-in or during the stay for an additional fee.

3 - CONDOMINIUM RULES

Building entrance

Guests will receive a key code prior to arrival.

Pools

The IBERLAGOS Complex has two swimming pools, one for adults with a length of 35m and the other for children.

To enter the pool area, you need your own card. The apartment has four free access cards for our guests to use. Cards are supplied in a plastic pocket to prevent loss.

Access cards are given at check-in and collected at check-out. The loss of each card costs €25.

Pool loungers are available for hire. Check availability and costs directly with the pool/bar manager.

Noise Law



between 23:00 and at 07:00

According to article 3 of Decree-Law no. 9/2007, Neighborhood noise is all the noise that is made inside the house but that bothers the neighbors.

The condominium security service is especially zealous in complying with this Law.

In case of non-compliance, the security guard will kindly ask people to respect him. If the noise does not cease immediately, the security guard is ordered to call the police to enforce the law.

Recycling

Garbage must be placed in the containers located near the entrance of the condominium.

We usually leave a garbage bag in each container for the first few days. If you consider that these bags are insufficient during your stay, you will have to buy the remaining garbage bags. There is no need to buy colored bags for different types of recycling. Please recycle. The environment will appreciate your effort.

Odors

Charcoal cooking or grilling food on a similar appliance is not permitted indoors or on the porch.



Grilling causes unpleasant odors and fumes. The condominium has a very strict policy regarding the preparation of food on the apartments' balconies. In this way, your neighbors will not be able to bother you with these odors.

4 - USEFUL INFORMATION

Water consumption

Algarve is in extreme drought. The flow from the taps has been reduced by 25%.

The dam that supplies Lagos is at 10 per cent of its capacity. The next step will be to ban watering golf courses, gardens, filling swimming pools and washing cars throughout the Algarve during the summer months. We therefore ask you to please SAVE WATER. Don't prolong your shower time, turn off the tap while brushing your teeth.



Please use only as much water as you need.

Tap water is suitable for human consumption. You can find the results of tap water analyzes in the Algarve at this link:

Spiderfish bite: What to do?

It's not usual to be stung by spiderfish, but there are beaches with finer sand where they are more common. In Lagos, especially at low tide, there may be occurrences on the beaches of Porto de Mós and Meia Praia.

Spiderfish hide in the sand and therefore it is not easy to see them when going to the sea. In addition, the water is not always transparent and, in areas where there are feet, where bites almost always happen, the surf lifts the sand, making it even more difficult to see the bottom.

One solution to avoid spiderfish bites is to wear shoes suitable for walking in water, with plastic soles, which are sold in sports stores or large commercial areas.

When you are stung by a spiderfish, you may initially think that you have stepped on a rock or a sharp shell, feel a pain mild, but which evolves almost immediately into intense pain, difficult to bear, with changes in the surrounding skin, which becomes red and swollen.



If you are stung, stay calm and ask your family members or friends who are with you and the lifeguard to follow these steps:

- As soon as possible, place the bite area in hot sand;
- Immerse the bite area in hot water for about 30 minutes. Ideally, the water temperature should be above 40°C, as the poison degrades in heat. However, be careful with the water at high temperatures so as not to cause a burn. This procedure will only be effective if performed within the first 30 minutes after the bite. If you don't have the possibility to use hot water, try bringing another source of heat closer to the bitten area;
- Oral pain relief therapy with analgesics or anti-inflammatories such as paracetamol or ibuprofen, respectively;
- Check to see if any spiderfish spines have broken off and are left in the skin.
 If so, you will need to remove it. Visible thorns must be removed without using the hands directly, for example with tweezers;
- Disinfect the bite site, as you would with any other common wound;

If after these steps you do not feel pain relief, you should seek medical help.

Local anesthesia, for example in the form of sprays which are often available, should not be used. It is contraindicated because at first the pain relieves due to vasoconstriction, but it does not prevent the spiderfish venom from continuing to circulate in the bloodstream.

Portuguese Caravel bite (Physalia Physalis): what to do?

The Portuguese caravel appears very sporadically in the waters of the Algarve, but if you see anything similar to this picture in the water or on the sand, don't touch it.



The caravel bite can cause burns up to third degree as well as some of the following symptoms:

- Intense and instantaneous pain;
- Gastrointestinal symptoms (abdominal pain, nausea and vomiting);
- Muscle spasms;
- Headache;
- Somnolence;
- fainting;
- Cardiorespiratory disorders.

If you are stung by a Portuguese caravel, it is recommended to wash the wound with salt water and add vinegar. The purpose of vinegar is to help stem the discharge of poison into the affected person's body.

Under no circumstances should you apply alcohol, fresh water, or press the affected area with a compress. This speeds up the process of passing the venom into the bloodstream.

6 - THE CITY AND LOCAL TRADE

There is no shortage of stunning sites in and around Lagos. For those who don't know the city, we recommend that you go to the lively Mercado Municipal, where fish and seafood are the protagonists.



Weekly or monthly, there are several craft fairs, organic products, sweets and traditional drinks. Lagos has a full schedule of events, exhibitions and guided tours.



With the mild temperatures in winter and hot in summer that characterize the Algarve, there is no shortage of options for activities nautical: surfing, windsurfing and kitesurfing, stand up paddle, diving in warships shipwrecks, jet ski rental, kayak trips, wakeboard park and deep sea fishing among others.

For the whole family, we highlight the visit to the caves, dolphin watching and boat trip with lunch.



In addition to hiking and horseback riding, the more adventurous can practice paintball, play tennis or padel, activities within walking distance of *Casa da Tartaruga*.

For golf lovers there are several professional golf courses or mini-golf.



If you are a hiking lover, our suggestion is to start from the wonderful Praia da D. Ana, right in front of the Urbanization, and follow the trails to Praia do Camilo, one of the most scenic in the Algarve.





You can follow the route along the cliffs to the Lighthouse of Ponta da Piedade, not forgetting to go down the stairs that lead to the idyllic beaches.



Once at the Lighthouse, take the walkways from Ponta da Piedade to Praia do Canavial and, later, to Praia de Porto de Mós, a few hundred meters further on. In summer time, the beaches are perfect for an invigorating swim halfway through the hike. If you choose to combine the trail along the cliffs with the Ponta da Piedade walkway, you'll have to travel 8 km (round trip), but you won't mind the effort!

Don't forget to bring a bottle of water, a bathing suit and a camera.

Watching the sunset at Ponta da Piedade or have dinner at Camilo restaurant after a walk along the cliffs is priceless.



During the summer we strongly advise you to book a table in advance

For a different day, we suggest you rent bicycles or scooters to move around Lagos and its surroundings, discovering streets and alleys with shops and picturesque restaurants.

City Public Buses

9 - TOURIST POINTS OF INTEREST AND OTHER MUST-SEE PLACES

Less than 50Km from Lagos, you can visit several places admired worldwide, namely the cave next to *Benagil* beach.

For those who enjoy hiking, we recommend the picturesque village of *Monchique* with its thermal baths, the *Miradouro da Foia*, which is located at the highest point in the Algarve.

Monchique is also known for its picnic parks and traditional sweets and drinks.

For speed lovers, we recommend a visit to the *Autódromo Internacional do Algarve*, also known as the MotoGP and F1 roller coaster.

Especially for the younger ones, we suggest a visit to the Zoo Marine in Albufeira



and to the Sand City in Lagoa,



the Lagos Zoo and the *Centro de Ciência Viva de Lagos* are also popular places to visit.

Lagos assumes great importance at the time of the "Discoveries".

From here the *Infante D. Henrique* departed in caravels in search of new worlds and here the first riches of Africa arrived.

In 1755, Lagos was completely devastated by the earthquake and later saw Napoleon's troops arrive in its bay.

We highly recommend a visit to the Museum of Lagos and the Church of Sto. Antonio.



A little further away you can find several places with traces of the presence of the Roman civilization in the Algarve, such as the "Promontorium Sacrum" dedicated to the God Saturn, located in the extreme southwest of continental Europe in Sagres.



10 - RESTAURANT SUGGESTIONS

In Lagos, the gastronomic offer is varied and it is difficult to eat badly. Starting at the seafood restaurant "O Perceve", passing by the picturesque "The Garden", the exquisite "Alma Lusa" or the well-known "Chico Zé" in Odiáxere, the "Tasca do Kiko", The "Calhou", "O Lamberto", the "Don Gull" and ending at the restaurant "O António", on the beach in Porto de Mós or "Camilo" on the top of Camilo Beach, all of them are excellent.

During the summer time, the most asked question is: And sardines!!??? Where can we eat sardines?



Okay, let's put it this way:

1. Sardines are eaten between June and October. Avoid eating fish on Mondays because fishermen don't go out to sea on Sundays and therefore the fish served in restaurants on Mondays was probably caught on the previous Friday or Saturday and therefore will not be as fresh as on other days. 2. Sardines, if grilled over charcoal, are very popular and there won't be much difference between one restaurant and another.

So, what makes the difference? The difference is in the way of eating the sardines:

First of all, you should put a slice of bread on the plate where the sardines are placed. The sardines are opened and drizzled with quality olive oil. One after the other, eating them on top of the bread, they soak the bread with the oil and fat from the sardines. The skin, bones and guts are not eaten but can be pushed against the slice of bread to add more flavor.

The only thing that can side a meal of sardines, in addition to boiled potatoes, is "salada algarvia" (tomato, cucumber, onion, roasted green pepper plus oregano), and a glass of wine. At the end, the bread is eaten, if you managed to resist.

Because sardines, green pepper and cucumbers are more difficult to digest, this dish is usually enjoyed at lunch.

Here in Lagos, the restaurant "Escondidinho" (next to the church of S. Sebastião) was much sought after by the locals but since the owner passed away people say that it has gotten a lot worse.

The night can be spent in the many bars in the city center, if you like live music you can find it in "Amuras" next to the marina. You can also opt for a trip to *Casino Solverde* in Praia da Rocha, taking the opportunity to spend the rest of the night in the many nightclubs that exist there.
